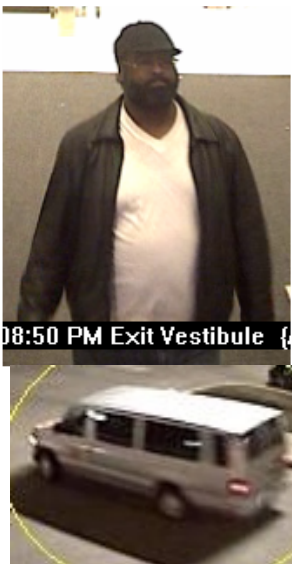




January 28, 2011 (COW 1389 - Credit Card Fraud)

The Chesterfield County/Colonial Heights Crime Solvers program needs your help to solve two separate thefts in which credit cards were stolen from victims at Johnston Willis Hospital on Tuesday, Sep. 28, 2010 and Friday, Dec. 10, 2010.

The suspect managed to gain entry into two separate employees' offices and stole their wallets from their purses, and then used the stolen credit cards to make fraudulent purchases throughout Chesterfield and the City of Richmond. Several thousand dollars in purchases and withdrawals were made to the victims' cards. The suspect was photographed by security cameras making a transaction at the Target located at 11301 Midlothian Turnpike. The suspect appears to be a middle-aged male and may be Caucasian or Hispanic.



January 21, 2011 (COW 1388 - Turbo Tax Deluxe Thefts)

Case Closed Three Chesterfield County Target stores experienced similar and unusual shopliftings.

The Target stores at 11301 Midlothian Turnpike, 4601 Commonwealth Center Parkway and 201 Perimeter Street (Westchester Commons) all reported that two black males and one black female worked together to steal approximately 90 copies of Turbo Tax Deluxe software. The value was more than \$5,000.



The suspect who first walked into the store was a heavy-set black male, 40-50 years old, wearing jeans, a white, V-neck T-shirt and a dark jacket. He had a full beard and eyeglasses, as well. The second male suspect was 20-30 years old. He wore eyeglasses, a black do-rag, dark pants, and a dark blue jacket with a black and grey sleeveless coat over the jacket. The female suspect was heavyset, 40-50 years old, wearing red pants, a red sweatshirt, with a blue and grey sleeveless coat over the sweatshirt. She also had eyeglasses, but she wore them



on her forehead. The three left the lot in a large white van.

January 14, 2011 (COW 1387 - Robbery/Walgreens and CVS)



Case Closed The Chesterfield County/Colonial Heights Crime Solvers program needs your help to identify and find the person responsible for committing robberies of the Walgreens at 11119 Hull Street Road on Thursday, Dec. 23, and the CVS at 13800 Hull Street Road on Friday, Dec. 31. Authorities believe the same suspect also attempted to rob the Walgreens at 20 Buford Road on Wednesday, Dec. 22.



A large number of Percocet pills were taken during the robberies. The suspect is said to have presented the pharmacist with his demands on a note. The suspect is described as a black male in his early 20s with a slim build. The suspect was photographed in one of the incidents wearing a yellow hooded sweatshirt with sequins on it. In another incident, the suspect was photographed wearing a jacket with the word "Girbaud" on the front.
