

## **July 29, 2011 (COW 1415 - Robbery/Shooting)**



The Chesterfield County/Colonial Heights Crime Solvers program needs your help to identify and find the men who shot at and attempted to rob four victims in the 3300 block of Meadowdale Boulevard on Friday, July 15, 2011 at about 11:15 p.m.

Four suspects approached four victims and demanded money at gunpoint. Two of the suspects were armed with handguns. During the robbery, one victim fought with one of the gunmen. The second gunman then fired several rounds at the victims. One of the victims was hit by the gunfire. After being shot at, the victims continued to fight with the suspect, but the suspects were able to get away and avoid capture. The witnesses described the suspects as black males in their early 20s with thin or slender builds.

## **July 22, 2011 (COW 1414 - Homicide of James Mosley)**



The Chesterfield County/Colonial Heights Crime Solvers program needs your help to identify and find the people responsible for shooting and killing a man in the 3900 block of Bridget Court on Friday, Nov. 12, 2010, at about 11:40 p.m.

Officers were called for shots being fired in the area. While checking the area, officers found James Patrick Mosley in the parking lot of his townhouse. Mosley had been shot several times. Officers and rescue personnel attempted to resuscitate Mosley, but were unsuccessful. Witnesses described seeing a black male wearing a dark-colored hooded sweatshirt in the area at the time of the shooting. A dark-colored vehicle was also seen leaving the area at a high rate of speed shortly after the shooting.

### **July 15, 2011 (COW 1413 - Home Invasion)**

The Chesterfield County/Colonial Heights Crime Solvers program needs your help to identify and find the man who is responsible for a home invasion in the 3400 block of Osborne Road on Sunday, May 29, 2011 at about 4 p.m.

The suspect entered the victim's home and later forced the victim to the second story of the residence. The suspect ransacked a room in the residence and managed to locate a safe. The victim was then taken to another room where her hands and feet were bound. The suspect was able to flee the residence with the safe. The victim was later able to free herself and call for help. The suspect is described as a masked black male, 30 to 40 years old, 6 feet, 1 inch tall, clean shaven with a dark complexion and a thin to slender build. The suspect in this case was armed with a brown and silver handgun.

### **July 8, 2011 (COW 1412 - Theft at Uriel Trucking)**

A truck driver stole from another truck driver in Chesterfield County, and the Chesterfield County/Colonial Heights Crime Solvers program needs your help this week to identify him.



On June 13, at about 6:40 p.m., the driver of a light-colored Freightliner truck parked a trailer on the lot of Uriel Trucking, 5436 Jefferson Davis Highway, and then left the lot. The truck returned just prior to 10 p.m. and the driver reconnected the trailer to the truck. Security footage showed the subject look into the office, then attempt to gain entry into another truck that was parked on the lot. He then approached a second truck, gained entry and stole CB radio equipment. The suspect's truck

left the lot several minutes after 10 p.m.

The suspect was a black male who appeared to be wearing light-colored clothes. The truck he was driving had no company logos on the truck or the trailer.



### **July 1, 2011 (COW 1411 - Arson Near Celebration at the Reservoir)**

The Chesterfield County/Colonial Heights Crime Solvers program needs your help to solve an arson in which 5 to 6 acres of wooded area were burned in the area of Celebration at the Reservoir and the Woodlake Subdivision at about 3 p.m. on Wednesday, April 20.



The fire was started in the wooded area adjacent to the 5100 block of Highberry Woods Road in the Woodlake Subdivision. Witnesses describe frequently seeing three to four male juveniles in the area in which the fire was started. Witnesses describe the male juveniles as white males with long hair, all wearing skateboarder-style clothing.
